

Childcare Terms & Conditions for Reopening

Hours:

FSI Hours – Monday – Friday 8am – 12pm

FSII Hours – Monday – Thursday 8am – 12pm & 4pm – 8pm
Friday – Saturday 8am – 12pm
Sunday 10am – 1pm

Time Limit: We will be limiting the time allowed in childcare. Each child will be allowed 1 hour and 30 minutes total **per day** in childcare. This includes drop off and pick up.

Check-in Process: Only one family at a time is allowed in the check-in area of the childcare room. Please have your childcare release cards ready upon room check in (If you have lost your card, please visit the front desk to complete a new card prior to coming into childcare).

Capacity Limits: Due to limited capacity, waitlists may occur during peak hours.

Four Seasons One – 8 children at a time

Four Seasons Two – Infant Room: 10 children at a time

Big Kid Room: 15 children at a time

Guidelines to follow when utilizing Childcare: Children over the age of 2 are required to wear a mask while in the childcare room. Childcare employees will ask parents a series of questions regarding their child's health before entering the room each visit. Please see below for the health questions. Childcare employees will also be taking every child's and parent's temperature before entering the room. If a child is deemed at risk, has visible symptoms of illness, or either parent/child has a temperature, they will not be permitted to check into the childcare room. In addition, if a child becomes ill while in childcare, the parent will be notified and must remove their child from childcare promptly. The child must be symptom free for 72 hours before they can return. Parents are asked to notify Four Seasons if their child tests positive with COVID-19. We are not allowing personal items into the childcare rooms, this includes leaving diaper/book bags, car seats, etc. in the check in area (this does not include epi pens and the epi pen case holder). We will allow those children who need to complete online learning to do so in the childcare rooms. If you would like to have your child complete their schoolwork in the childcare rooms, they will ONLY be allowed to bring in the minimum items needed such as laptop, headphones, notebook, and pen. With the variety of children, we could have in childcare, the childcare employees may not be equipped to answer schoolwork questions.

Per the Illinois Department of DCFS Children & Family Services:

If the child is diagnosed with COVID-19, he or she is not to return to the childcare facility until ALL three of the following are met:

- Individual is free from fever without the use of fever-reducing medications for at least 72 hours
- Individual's symptoms, including cough, have improved
- It has been at least 10 days since the onset of the individual's illness

If the child has symptoms of COVID-19 and it is subsequently determined by a medical provider that the individual likely does not have COVID-19, the child can return to childcare if the following is met:

- No fever for 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medications
- Negative test for COVID-19 or a note from a medical provider documenting no clinical suspicion of COVID-19 infection

The CDC recommends that any child with close contact (within 6 feet for greater than 15 minutes) to a person suspected or diagnosed with COVID-19 be excluded from the childcare for 14 days and monitored for symptoms. If symptoms develop, they are encouraged to be evaluated and tested for COVID-19.

Childcare Health Screening Questions

All children and parents entering childcare will have their temperature checked before entering the room

1. Have you or your child been in contact with someone in the last 14 days that has tested positive for COVID-19?

2. Is your child experiencing any of the following symptoms?
 - Fever *Child must be fever free without the use of fever reducing medications*
 - Shortness of Breath
 - Cough
 - Sore Throat
 - Vomiting
 - Diarrhea
 - Body Aches
